ABOUT THE GRACE BIBLE

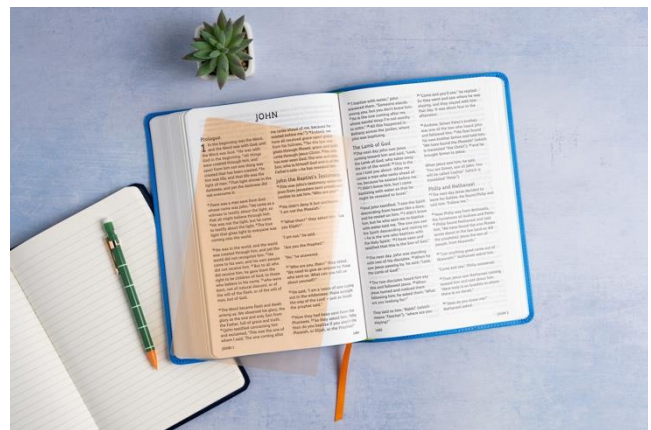

TALKING POINTS AND INTERVIEW ANGLES

According to the [International Dyslexia Association](#), 15-20% of the population has a language-based learning disability. Of the students with specific learning disabilities receiving special education services, 70-80% have deficits in reading. The *CSB Grace Bible for Kids* seeks to help enhance readability for kids who suffer from visual stress as they read.

Dyslexia often affects a kids' self-esteem. Reading difficulties can often cause a student to feel stressed and overwhelmed. Teasing by other students only adds to the stress and low self-esteem.

Dyslexia shouldn't keep kids from reading the Bible, and now it doesn't have to. At its core, the *CSB Grace Bible for Kids* is meeting the need of helping young readers interact and connect with God in a personal way through His Word.

Kids who feel intimidated by reading can feel comfortable with this new typeface in a Bible that's made specifically with them in mind.
