

"A Unity of Purpose" Celebrates 100 Years of the Cooperative Program

NASHVILLE, Tenn., April 30, 2025—"<u>A Unity of Purpose</u>," a new book commemorating the centennial anniversary of the Southern Baptist Convention's Cooperative Program, releases next month from <u>B&H Publishing Group</u>.

The Cooperative Program is the largest voluntary Great Commission funding mechanism in history. The book explores how Southern Baptists have collectively given over \$20 billion to fund local, national and international missions, educate pastors and church leaders and present a unified voice in the public square.



"The centennial anniversary of the Cooperative Program gives Southern Baptists a chance to thank God for His faithfulness and recommit ourselves to our cooperative mission," said Jeff Iorg, president of the SBC Executive Committee. "For 100 years, Southern Baptists have sacrificed and persevered as God has blessed our willingness to work together for Great Commission purposes. As we look toward the future, we must humble ourselves, seek the Lord's guidance and lean in for another century of cooperation."

Tony Wolfe, executive director-treasurer of the South Carolina Baptist Convention, and W. Madison Grace II, dean of the School of Theology at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, curated this volume to reflect on the impact over the past century and cast a vision for the future.

"The CP is a unifying force for Great Commission advance—a conduit for voluntary, cooperative, and sacrificial investment from the churches to the nations," Wolfe and Grace write in "A Unity of Purpose."

The book, released May 27, features a collection of Southern Baptist voices to offer a theological, historical and missional celebration of the Cooperative Program's past successes and future opportunities.


"The opportunity before us in our generation is great," said Wolfe. "Now is the time to celebrate the CP and educate our people on the what, why, and how of our shared mission."
