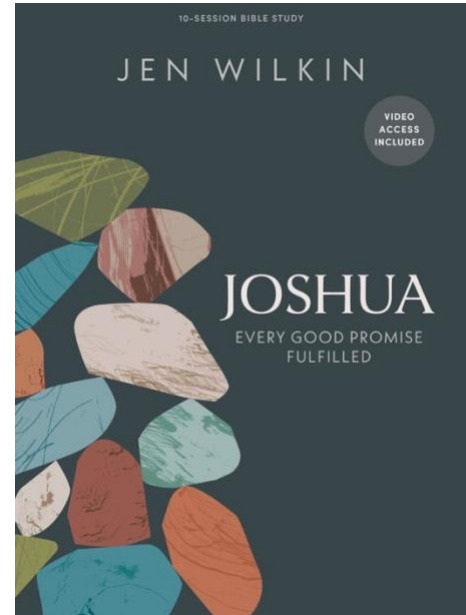


## **Jen Wilkin’s study, ‘Joshua,’ issues call to courageous obedience rooted in God’s faithfulness**

**BRENTWOOD, Tenn., Dec. 12, 2025**—“[Joshua: Every Good Promise Fulfilled](#),” a new Bible study from bestselling teacher and author Jen Wilkin, helps learners see God is faithful and has a beautiful inheritance for us.

Through a verse-by-verse study of the biblical text, “[Joshua](#)” invites women to witness the Lord’s faithfulness as He leads His people into the Promised Land and to respond with courageous obedience in their own daily lives.

“In the earliest pages of Genesis, God makes a threefold promise to Abraham, and it involves inheritance, family and blessing. It’s in the book of Joshua that we see the promise fulfilled,” says Wilkin.



Across the study, released by Lifeway Women, Wilkin traces key themes in Joshua:

- God’s promises and presence,
- the formation of a people marked by holiness,
- leadership under God’s authority,
- and practices of remembrance.

Readers will follow Israel’s movement from wilderness to inheritance, pausing at pivotal moments like the crossing of the Jordan, the fall of Jericho, battles and covenant renewal.

In addition to the Bible study, which features 10 video sessions available via streaming or on DVD, a [CSB Scripture Notebook is available with the text of Joshua](#) and added space for notes and journaling.

“God is working today to establish us in our inheritance which we have in Christ,” said Wilkin. “Israel’s story is our story, and just like them, we can trust He is keeping His promises, and we have a beautiful inheritance in Him.”

- Which key moments in Joshua most clearly showcase the Lord’s nearness, and how do those scenes reshape our expectations of God in uncertain seasons?
- The “stones of remembrance” become a recurring theme. How can churches and small groups create rhythms of remembrance today that mirror Joshua’s call to remember the Lord’s works?
- “Joshua” includes hard texts (e.g., warfare and conquest). How do you guide readers to approach these sections faithfully—holding together God’s justice, mercy and the grand redemptive storyline?
- What forms of everyday obedience do you hope women will practice after this study?
- Joshua follows Moses—a significant transition. What leadership lessons emerge for ministry leaders and volunteers who inherit work others have started?
